The scholarship work has also given me something positive to be part of during a year which has been difficult for many.

Financial News and an Invitation to Join In!

Last year our newsletter was all about celebrations and while the good news continues with over \$55K in donations in 2021 and over \$15K income from our on-line auction, our current focus is recruiting new people to our committee. I've been on the committee for over a decade now along with the bulk of our members. I joined the committee when I moved back to Randle after more than 20 years in the Air Force. I joined the committee when my sons were in pre-school and 1st grade. My oldest son just graduated from White Pass and is attending the University of Washington. More than half of the dozen active members of the committee have been there just as long as I. To be honest, we need fresh blood. So if you or your child have benefitted from a White Pass Scholarship, or if you have children in the school system and would like to know how to set them up with a scholarship, or you just want to give back to your community, join us. The Scholarship Committee is a super positive group of people and you won't regret getting involved.

Now on to some more financial news, specifically, financial history. In the last decade we've awarded \$403,000 to 146 White Pass Graduates. What an amazing impact our committee has had on our graduates! In the last five years we've had support from our donors to the tune of \$255K and earned \$128.8k in auction and car raffle sales. In those same five years we more than doubled our annual income from \$40,000 per year to \$103,000 in 2019. When I took over the treasurer duties 10 years ago, the scholarship fund had total assets of just under \$100,000, now we are building a self-sustaining legacy fund worth over \$70,000 so far and total assets over \$215K. Those are some pretty astounding success stories from such a small group of people with the support of this rural community. Fresh Start Scholarships are open to White Pass High School students who have earned a high school diploma or GED and who have not previously received money from the White Pass Scholarship Fund. With so many options for continuing education, we have expanded scholarship funding to include any accredited post-secondary program including college, university or trade school. Applicants who meet the criteria and are selected for an award will receive \$500 to help with the cost of their education.
