It's a First! First-generation college student and recipient of 4-year renewable scholarship completes degree by Alexis Roberts, Class of 2018

#### Hello!

My name is Alexis Roberts. I was the recipient of the Nancy Quinn Memorial Scholarship back in 2018. Having been accepted into Washington State University to pursue my passion for Science, I knew I needed to have some finances in order. I applied for a White Pass Scholarship and was so fortunate to receive the \$10,000 Nancy Quinn Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship money was a lifesaver as a first-generation college student. It helped me with those afterthought textbooks the professor forgot to put in the system, which made them not covered by financial aid. It provided the caffeinated drinks I needed so I could study extra hours to ace my Biology exams, and covered a last-minute shopping trip because I was unaware my dorm room had no AC. The scholarship made all those things, including loans, not an issue. It also helped me get ahead of my loans and start a payment plan for the remaining debt that financial aid wouldn't cover. This scholarship not only helped with these dilemmas, it saved my mental health, knowing I had a way to pay for these long-and short-term notice issues. Because of this scholarship, I could focus on my degree in General Biological Sciences with a Secondary Focus on Wild Ecology and Conservation. With this degree, I was given the opportunity to work at an environmental lab in the state of Florida, where I hope to eventually move through the system and work for the EPA studying the Florida Everglades. I am so glad I took a chance and applied for the White Pass Scholarship. I wouldn't be where I am today without the huge contribution to my future from the White Pass Scholarship Fund and the Nancy Quinn Memorial Sponsor. Thank you so much!

A goal of the White Pass Scholarship Fund in recent years has been to make available to our graduates a few multi-year, renewable scholarships. This effort became a reality in 2022 with the Nancy Quinn Memorial Scholarship. Funded through a foundation created by John Davidson (WP Class of 1973) this scholarship honors the memory of his friend and fellow classmate Nancy. This \$10,000 scholarship allowed Alexis to complete her four-year degree with an annual award of \$2,500.

Dave Bunting, longtime owner of the Highway Shopper in Packwood, offered a multi-year STEM scholarship beginning in 2019. The Class of 2023 will be eligible for this award again this spring. The White Pass Scholarship Fund supports both White Pass High School graduates and home school graduates from accredited programs who live in the White Pass School District. Applicants must have a 2.0 GPA, complete an application, and participate in an interview. Students planning to attend trade schools, licensure programs, 2 or 4 year colleges or universities are encouraged to apply.

### FINANCIAL NEWS – Making History

2022 was a record-breaking year for the White Pass Scholarship Fund. First record broken...
We had the highest income for a single year in our 60-plus year history, bringing in \$120,713! \$103,325 of that was from direct public support through donations from individuals, families, businesses and foundations. The remainder included \$15,414 from our 2022 online auction, income from interest, as well as advertising and special event donations. Bottom line is we are blessed with so many astounding donors who want to help our graduates. Second record broken...Applicants of the Class of 2022 were awarded our largest pool of funds ever! The six students who applied and qualified for scholarships from the Class of 2022 were awarded \$73,709, including two multi-year scholarships. Again, blowing away our previous high award amount of \$54K. Third record for the books... we kicked up our efforts to be more engaged with our graduates. By maintaining contact, checking in to see how things were going and reinforcing that their community was behind them, the Class of 2021 was the first class in my tenure on the committee, where ALL recipients successfully moved forward with their plans — qualifying for and claiming their full scholarship awards!

2023 is lining up to break other records. The Class of 2023 is one of the larger classes to come through White Pass High School in years, with over 40 high-achieving students. To send these amazing graduates off with the support they deserve, we'll be looking to the community, alumni, and friends for their continued donation commitments. The committee is doing their part by bringing back an in-person event on March 18<sup>th</sup>. We've also discovered more employers who provide matching funds for individual donations — some even making this program available to their retirees. Consider checking into this to see if it's an option for you. We're excited to explore what the future holds and what other records we can break! Please join our efforts.
