Students observe construction trades though local unions and are exposed to military options by visiting Joint Base Lewis McCord. Maureen's goal is that all students have opportunities to be on campuses or see different trades that are available to them. *Broadening Horizons!*



Back when I graduated from White Pass HS in 1991, the main fundraiser for the scholarship fund was the community birthday calendars (which I kind of miss now that I have moved back to Randle, to be honest). The White Pass Scholarship paid for tuition in my first year at college, and this was a huge help for me and my family. I attended Central Washington University, majoring in French and Spanish with plans to become a teacher. I knew I wanted to be a teacher when I was in second grade, but being the first person in my family to go to college I didn't know very much about the application process or options for scholarships. Staff here at White Pass made sure we all knew about the scholarship and how to apply. The same is true today as staff members continue to support students in navigating their post-secondary options.

My teaching and administrative career led me to Vancouver, Washington and then to Tualatin, Oregon. After such a wonderful experience at White Pass, I had always known that I wanted to come back to the valley. I introduced my husband to the area, and he also fell in love with the mountains and the rural community that I grew up in. My dad, who still works for the school district, has kept me informed on all the White Pass news, and when he told me about a possible opening here for the 2023-24 year, I knew it was meant to be. I sent in my resume the same day the job was posted and was able to find a great house to buy in Randle. I count myself lucky every single day as I drive around this beautiful area!

White Pass has many strengths that I am working to highlight. Our CTE programs like construction and welding are providing great experiences for students. We're rebuilding our FFA, Agriculture and Business programs along with our arts programs to provide a well-rounded experience for students. We work with Centralia College to provide Running Start opportunities for students and are planning to develop culinary and child development programs in the coming years. In addition to offering exciting classes, we want every single student to be involved in at least one after-school activity such as sports, FFA, FBLA, clubs, community service projects or the arts. Our combined elementary and high school winter concert brought the three communities together in December, and we want to do more things to involve families and the community. Great things are happening at White Pass! I have joined the scholarship committee and have learned a lot more about the amazing White Pass Scholarship Fund. I am proud to live and work in a community that places such value on the success of our young people. The financial support provided by this scholarship fund is changing lives and building futures for so many!
